The property Christmas decoration competition was a huge success. What an amazing effort and congratulations to the Kingseat Top House for taking out the win.


We now have a Totara Farm Trust Award Board with this competition the first to get a badge. We will have more competitions through the year to add to the fun.

We have some feedback that some families would like an update on finances. The sector is very stretched and the recent 1% increase across residential services really has very little positive impact. However, we remain very close to budget and the Leadership Team keeps a beady eye on managing costs without impacting on staffing levels and quality of support.

We have completed the fleet upgrade and own, rather than lease, all of our vehicles.

We are confident all vehicles are fit for purpose and that all properties have an appropriate level of vehicles for the number of people supported and that we can respond to their choices around how they want to spend their time and achieve their personal goals.
